UNVEILING OF EDWARD BRUCE MONUMENT IN IRELAND

The 705 anniversary of the death of Edward Bruce, High King of Ireland was commemorated at Faughart Graveyard with the unveiling of The Bruce Boulder by Lord Bruce, a direct descendent of Edward.

Edward Bruce was sent to Ireland by his older brother King Robert the Bruce and was crowned High King of Ireland in June 1316. In October 1318, at the Battle of Faughart, Edward was killed and his corpse dismembered, with parts distributed across Ireland, some buried at Faughart and his severed head presented to King Edward II of England.

Hosted by the Faughart Community Group and commissioned by The Ulster-Scots Agency, the Bruce Boulder is part of the Bruce Trail, which marks important sites linked with Edward Bruce.
